Rolls Royce celebrates 60 years of the James Bond film 'Goldfinger'



The Rolls Royce Phantom Goldfinger is a one-of-one masterpiece incorporating some of the most extensively engineered and hand-crafted bespoke items ever produced. It is designed to celebrate sixty years of the 1964 James Bond film *Goldfinger* and was unveiled in October 2024. It is a tribute to Auric Goldfinger's 1937 Rolls Royce Phantom III Sedanca de Ville featured in the film.

Special details include a solid 18-carat gold bar in the shape of a stylised miniature of the car displayed in the centre console, picnic tables featuring a fictional map of the Fort Knox bullion reserve inlaid in 22-carat gold, a three-dimensional steel and gold gallery incorporating an isoline map of the legendary Furka Pass and a starlight headlining matching the sky constellation seen above the pass during filming of the scene back in 1964.

As a finishing touch, the prized UK numberplate AU 1, which graced the original Goldfinger Phantom III used in the film, has been secured. AU is the chemical symbol for gold on the periodic table of elements. This cherished registration will remain with the Phantom Goldfinger, which has been delivered to a significant Rolls Royce client and collector based in the UK.
